HELLO MR. CONDUCTOR! - GRADES PRE-K & KINDERGARTEN (IP)

Through songs, games, and crafts, we will take an imaginary train journey. This experience offers a great introduction to museums, theaters, and being a great public citizen. Presented jointly with the Grand Theatre.

MAP HAPPENINGS - GRADE 1 (IP & V)

Learn about cardinal and intermediate directions and map symbols; Learn how to use a compass; Hunt for treasure in an interactive map activity. Presented jointly with the Grand Theatre.

CHEROKEE CULTURE FROM EAST TO WEST - GRADE 2 (IP)

Experience and discuss Cherokee home life in Georgia, Sequoyah and the development of the Cherokee syllabary, and the move west on the Trail of Tears. Presented jointly with the Booth Western Art Museum.

COLONIAL LIFE - GRADE 3 (V)

Learn about the New England, Mid-Atlantic, and Southern colonies including Georgia's position as the 13th colony; Experience daily life in the Southern colonies as you learn about farmers, women, children and servants; Make an old fashioned toy; Discover Georgia's connection to the Declaration of Independence.

EUROPEAN EXPLORERS AND AMERICAN INDIAN CULTURES - GRADE 3 (IP & V)

Compare and contrast myths, legends, and cultures of American Indian groups; See how American Indians use their environment for food, clothing, and shelter; Learn about Scottish traders and Hernando de Soto encounters with American Indians. Presented jointly with the Grand Theatre.

FREEDOM 101 - GRADE 4 (IP)

Participate in an interactive interview activity with nine key historic figures who shaped the revolutionary movement and fought for voters' rights; Learn about the 13th, 14th, and 15th Amendments, The Freedmen's Bureau, the impact of Jim Crow; Stage a protest march. Presented jointly with the Grand Theatre.

CIVIL WAR: THE UNION DISSOLVED - GRADE 4 & 8 (IP)

Learn about the causes of the Civil War; Compare and contrast the Northern and Southern economies and social structure; Learn about the Battle of Atlanta and Sherman's March to the Sea; Explore life in a military camp; See a Civil War medicine demonstration. Grade 8 version also includes primary source documents.

WORLD WAR I AND THE GREAT DEPRESSION - GRADE 5 (IP & V)

Learn about the sinking of the RMS. Lusitania and other causes of WWI; Learn about fighting on the Western front, diversity in war, and war remembrance; Explore cultural changes in the post-war era and learn how to do the Charleston; Learn about life during the Great Depression; Participate in a math-based activity about scarcity and making choices during the Great Depression.

HOME FRONT, BATTLEFRONT- GRADE 5 (IP & V)

Explore the lives of the men, women, and children who lived during World War II; Hear Franklin D. Roosevelt address the nation; Hear a Bartow County WWII veteran's account of the battle of Iwo Jima; Discover ration books, victory gardens, 1940's lingo, and propaganda; Participate in a rationing activity. Presented jointly with the Grand Theatre.

THE AMERICAN INDIAN EXPERIENCE: CHEROKEE FOCUS- GRADE 8 (IP)

Explore Cherokee life before and after the Trail of Tears; Learn about the removal of the Cherokee; Discuss the Right of Discovery, trade culture, the Dahlonega Gold Rush, and land lotteries. Presented jointly with the Booth Western Art Museum and The Etowah Indian Mounds.

EXPLORING THE ARCHIVES - GRADES 6 - 12 (IP & V)

See primary resources available for research; Learn how museum professionals care for archive and collection items, including proper handling of archival materials; Pick up tips and tricks for using primary sources for research.
